Class 1 News

Class One have made a fantastic start to the new year, adapting to changes in the timetable, challenging themselves in their learning and welcoming the new pre-school children so well.















This week in maths the Reception children started a new unit called 'Alive in 5', in which they have been developing their subtising skills.

We have introduced new maths group names for the Year One and Two children, the hexagons and the pentagons. The Hexagons have been working on place value up to 20, this week focusing on counting within 20 and understanding 10, 11, 12, and 13. The pentagons have started a unit on money, this week focusing on counting pounds and pence.

In English, the Year One and Two children have been learning all about setting descriptions. They have created a checklist of the key features needed and identified them in descriptions. We have also been thinking of the adjectives we could use to describe a given setting.

A great first week back, keep it up, Class One.

Welcome back to School! We hope you all had a very relaxing Christmas period. There have been a lot of changes for the children this week including a few changes in the timetable and a new class teacher to name a few! The children have all settled in brilliantly and I have enjoyed getting to know each and every one of them.
